ANNOUNCEMENT & RULES

- ORGANISING BODY:** Iceworld Figure Skating Club Inc., affiliated with the I.S.Q.
- DESCRIPTION:** "Theatre on Ice" is an annual Theatre on Ice competition, being held in conjunction with Winter Sun. This competition is to be run under club rules.
- VENUE:** Iceworld Olympic Ice Rink, 1179 Beaudesert Road, ACACIA RIDGE Qld 4110.
- ICE SURFACE:** The dimensions of the ice surface are 60m x 26m.
- DIVISIONS:** • **NOVICE, JUNIOR, SENIOR, ADULT, Free Program only**
- DATES:** **WEDNESDAY 7TH TO SUNDAY 11TH JULY 2010**
- NOTE: "Theatre on Ice" will be held in conjunction with **Winter Sun, Le Patinage Artistique** and **Solo Dance**. (refer to the companion announcements). The times will depend on entry numbers in all 4 competitions.
- TIMES:** Starting times will be advised approximately 14 days prior to the events.
- DRAW:** Draws for Start Order will take place on **Tuesday, 22nd June at 5:00pm** at the rink.
- ENTRIES:** **Entries must be submitted through State Associations** and will be accepted by the Competition Convenor of the I.F.S.C. until the closing date.
- THE ENTRY FEE MUST ACCOMPANY ALL ENTRIES.**
- NOTE: There is no official practice for TOI.

CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES: **Monday 14th June 2010**

ENTRY FEES:

Novice, Junior, Senior \$180.00 PLUS
and Adult \$ 20.00 per team member

Entry fees provide team members plus one chaperone per 4 team members, each with free admission to all competition and official practice sessions.

LATE ENTRIES:

Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Competition Convenor but will run the risk of not being accepted and will incur a penalty of double the entry fee. **No Entries** will be accepted after the draw.

ELIGIBILITY:

The competition is open to teams of 8 to 30 skaters in the following divisions:

Novice, Junior Adult & Senior

Technical Requirements:

This Competition will be run under Club rules:

MEMBERSHIP¹

Skaters who have passed the ISA Preliminary test:

- **must be financial members of their State Association and an affiliated Club; the memberships must be valid during the full competition period.**

Skaters who have NOT passed the ISA Preliminary test:

- ***Queensland Skaters:* must be financial members of a Club affiliated with the ISQ; the membership must be valid during the full competition period.**
- ***Interstate Skaters who haven't passed Preliminary:* as required by your state organisation; the membership(s) must be valid during the full competition period.**

Overseas entrants:

- **must be financial members of an ISU member skating organisation and/or its affiliates, as required by their national organisation; the membership(s) must be valid during the full competition period.**

NOTE: Team members need not be members of the same club, but all clubs represented on a team must be affiliated with the same state association. (For overseas teams, all from the same country.)

MERGING OF DIVISIONS:

If only one entry is received in one of the divisions, the divisions may, at the discretion of the organising committee, be combined.

MUSIC:

Music must:

- be provided on Compact Disc,
- contain only one track,
- be marked with:
 - team's name,
 - program description (i.e. "TOI")
 - division (e.g. Adult)
 - exact running time of the music (not skating time).

The CD must *not* contain a recorded program description. (This is a temporary arrangement until TOI becomes established in Australia.)

WRITTEN PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

A written description of the performance should be provided by the team to the Competition convenor by 30th June 2010, but preferably provided on the entry form.

The description should be no more than 100 words in length and should be provided in English. The description should not take more than 20 seconds to read.

This description will be read before the performance (see later).

MARKING:

Marking will be closed.

TROPHIES:

Medals will be awarded to the first three place-getting teams of each division.

PERPETUAL TROPHY:

A Perpetual Trophy will be awarded for Theatre On Ice.

The Trophy will be retained by IFSC Inc. and will be engraved with the winner's name and year.

JUDGES:

Each state or Club is invited to nominate a judge or judges for one, both or all four of the competitions. It would be appreciated if these nominations could be advised at the same time as entries are submitted, or as soon as possible thereafter.

COMPOSITION

The performance should express a theme, emotion or story. The music, costumes, scenery, as well as the choreography should be used to enhance the theme.

Jumps and other figure skating elements should contribute to the choreography and need to have meaning within the theme. There is no limit to the number of jumps that may be done, however, jumps must have a meaning in relation to the theme and should not be gratuitous.

Solos, pairs, dance or synchronized elements also need to have meaning within the theme. They can not be a dominant part of the performance.

The choreography should emphasize and support gliding. Stationary positions should be limited and excessive use be reflected in the marking accordingly.

All participants must wear their skates on the ice at all times.

COSTUMING

Costumes must be decent. Hair and ornaments must be secure. Costuming and make-up should enhance the feeling created by the performance.
